UMBC has officially reached the nation's highest level of research performance. The Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education announced that UMBC has been placed into the category of <u>doctoral universities</u> <u>with very high research activity</u>, popularly known as Research 1 (or R1). UMBC is now ranked as one of only 146 R1 institutions nationally, including 107 public and 39 private universities.

Whether working in the forefront or behind the scenes, staff hold key positions across the campus supporting UMBC's mission and success. We need your help to identify and nominate the very best of UMBC's outstanding exempt and non-exempt staff members for these awards.
